Glitter Glue is especially popular with the young ladies at Oak Creek. The women at Coffee Creek Prison have a library which could use a few more books about labyrinths.

Inmates at Coffee Creek Prison have a Puppy Program training service dogs for disabled people. This program is funded entirely by donation. This includes monetary donations as well as donations of dog treats, toys, etc.
