Register now for the LNN Summer Labyrinth Pilgrimage

This year's pilgrimage is an opportunity to experience 2 wonderful labyrinths.

In the morning we will be at Mid-Columbia Medical Center in The Dalles where they have a beautiful big outdoor labyrinth. The hospital's music thanatologist will play harp music for our labyrinth walk. This hospital is has an outstanding labyrinth program, and the hospital labyrinth facilitator will tell us all about it. This is one of the first and one of the best hospital labyrinths in the world.

In the afternoon we will visit a private labyrinth at a retreat center out in the country at Quinn Mountain a few miles from Washougal, WA. Bring a sack lunch to eat in the shade near the labyrinth. The owner of the labyrinth tell us the story of her labyrinth and then we'll have an opportunity to walk it.

This pilgrimage is an all-day event, but if you are only able to go half the day, let me know. Half day arrangements will be on a space available basis.
