Labyrinth Network Northwest, a not-for-profit organization that facilitates communication and cooperation between labyrinth-interested individuals in the Pacific Northwest, is proud to host this three-day labyrinth event at three of Greater Portland, Oregon's most well-known and beloved permanent labyrinth locations.

Dr. Jill Geoffrion plans to speak on various subjects over the three day period, drawn from her work as an international Labyrinth Ambassador and published author of seven books, her many pilgrimages to Chartres Cathedral and extensive experience with labyrinths around the world.

LOCATIONS: Friday, June 24, 6:30-10:30 pm, [Trinity Episcopal Cathedral](#) 147 Northwest 19th Avenue, Portland, OR 97209-1901– Topic: “*Labyrinth Prayer: Hope in the Midst of Suffering*,” Dr. Geoffrion’s program, designed to interest everyone regardless of their spiritual orientation, will take participants to four continents with a photo-tour of her labyrinth prayer ministry. Come learn why people the world over experience healing when using labyrinths.

After the presentation participants can walk a special temporary labyrinth on the grounds while Trinity’s Labyrinth Guild prepares their beautiful inlaid-wood labyrinth for an indoor walk. Those new to labyrinths are invited to attend a short introduction first.

3:30 pm - “*Pilgrimages and Labyrinths: Walking There and Back*”

There will be many temporary labyrinths to walk throughout the day, a vendor marketplace selling handmade labyrinth products, three afternoon workshops to choose from, an “Appleton Dance”

group labyrinth walk and lots of opportunities for participants to network with labyrinth enthusiasts from all over the Pacific Northwest and elsewhere.
