The labyrinth will be open for quiet, meditative walking from 4 to 7 pm. Muller will be on hand to answer any questions, or provide guidance upon request. From 7 to 8:30 pm, accompanied by live music, Pierce will lead Dances of Universal Peace on the labyrinth. He will teach and guide participants through dances and sacred songs, sharing the origin and meaning of both. This event is all made possible by donations from the public, and the generosity of the Congregational Church of Lincoln City-United Church of Christ. There is a suggested minimum donation of \$2 for the walk and \$5 for the dance.

ABOUT THE LABYRINTH

The indoor hand-painted canvas labyrinth is modeled after the one in Chartres Cathedral. In its simplest form it is a single winding path leading to the center and back out. The lotus in the center signifies a place for prayer, meditation, and reflection. The labyrinth is an ancient symbol, known in many cultures for thousands of years. All are asked to honor the silence and be respectful of others along the path. In addition to holiday celebrations, people are also known to walk in honor of loved ones who have passed on, to give thanks or ask for help, and to enter the mystery of life. There are as many reasons as there are walkers, and all are welcome.

"What I love about walking the labyrinth is it's a different journey for each person each time," said Darlene Muller, volunteer who coordinates the labyrinth experience with Alex del Vecchio, another volunteer.

The LCCC hosts labyrinth walks four times a year, near the solstice and equinox. The next labyrinth event will be held Monday, Dec. 22.

ABOUT DANCES OF UNIVERSAL PEACE

The Dances of Universal Peace are simple, easy-to-learn movements and sacred songs honoring spiritual traditions from around the world including Hinduism, Buddhism, Christianity, Judaism,
